"ALL KIDS INCLUDED" YEAR-LONG SERIES OF FAMILY CULTURAL EVENTS MARKS 10 YEARS OF MAKING THE ARTS ACCESSIBLE TO CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES

Arts activities include concerts, exhibitions and performances throughout Miami-Dade County

(Miami – March 30, 2016) Everyone is invited as the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs celebrates the tenth anniversary of its popular "All Kids Included" (AKI) program with a year-long series of inclusive and accessible arts activities for children and families starting April 1st at multiple venues countywide, including Actors' Playhouse, Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden, New World Symphony and various Miami-Dade parks and libraries. For a decade, All Kids Included has promoted inclusive arts and cultural programs in school settings and throughout the community so that kids of all abilities and their families can participate fully in the arts. Serving thousands of children and families since 2006, AKI continually raises the bar with excellence in programming that promotes the benefit and importance of inclusionary arts and cultural programs for children and youth. To celebrate its 10th anniversary, AKI is presenting a year-long season of arts events to be held at family-friendly locations throughout Miami-Dade County in partnership with several community organizations.

Among the highlights of this year-long celebration is the touring exhibition of the annual AKI district-wide student visual art competition finalists, which was open to all Miami-Dade students in grades K-12. The competition asked student artists to submit original artwork depicting the theme "Celebrating Inclusion, Empathy and Understanding," inspired by the book, *A Boy and a Jaguar*, by Alan Rabinowitz, illustrated by Catia Chien.

Chien will make an appearance during the Miami-Dade Public Library System Family Storytelling Festival taking place on April 30th from 1-4pm, at the South Dade Regional Library, and Rabinowitz will make an appearance during the free 10th Annual AKI Family Arts Festival taking place on May 7th from 10am – 4pm at the South Miami-Dade Cultural Arts Center. In addition, free copies of <u>A Boy and a Jaguar</u> will be given away while supplies last at the Miami-Dade Public Library System Family Storytelling Festivals on

April 2nd, April 16th, and April 30th, and at the 10th Annual AKI Family Arts Festival on May 7th.

In addition, the free 10th Annual AKI Family Arts Festival will be held at the South Miami-Dade Cultural Arts Center on May 7th from 10am - 4pm. This multidisciplinary community arts festival for children and families with and without disabilities, will feature a Sensory-Friendly production of Big Bad Wolf by Australia's award-winning Windmill Theatre; free book give away while supplies last and special guest appearance by Alan Rabinowitz, author of A Boy and a Jaguar; deaf magician Magic Morgan; ASL storytelling from Waving Hands; Zot Artz – Arts for All adaptive painting and print making; AKI art contest exhibit and awards; fun fair activities; and a community resource fair for parents and caregivers.

Alan Rabinowitz has dedicated his life to wildlife conservation. A zoologist and conservationist, he is CEO of Panthera, a nonprofit organization devoted to protecting the world's thirty-eight wildcat species. He has written numerous scientific articles and books and been profiled in the *New York Times, Scientific American, Audubon, Outside, Jerusalem Report*, and *National Geographic Explorer*, among others. Dr. Rabinowitz is also an advocate for stutterers and a spokesperson for the Stuttering Foundation of America. He has told audiences that he feels lucky to have been given the gift of stuttering and believes that had he not stuttered, he would not be on the path of his passion — saving big cats. Her picture book titles include, Sydney Taylor gold award book The Longest Night and SILA gold medal award book, The Sea Serpent and Me. A Boy and a Jaguar written by Dr. Alan Rabinowitz is her most recent picture book. It tells the true story of Alan Rabinowitz as a little boy, about finding his own voice to speak for those who have no voice.
