Subject: FY 2014-2015 Youth Arts Enrichment Program Grant Award Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 33 grants for a total of \$450,000 from the FY 2014-2015 Youth Arts Enrichment Program.

BACKGROUND

The FY 2014-2015 Youth Arts Enrichment Program (YEP) Grants Panel, chaired by Councilor Alejandro Aguirre, convened on Monday, July 14, 2014 to review 46 applications requesting a total of \$673,480. The Panel recommended funding 33 applications for a total of \$450,000. Thirteen (13) applications scored below the threshold established by the Panel and were not recommended for funding.

YEP was created as a joint initiative of the Miami-Dade County Department of Cultural Affairs and The Children's Trust. The objective of the YEP Grants Program is to enrich the lives of children through the arts by making the arts available to more children and families throughout Miami-Dade County, whereby children will have opportunities to have positive live arts experiences through:

- Arts Instruction
- Arts Intervention
- Healing/Expressive Arts
- In-school Performances
- Public Performances/Exhibitions

Applicants to this program must have a minimum two-year track record of providing high quality, cultural arts programs for children and/or youth. Units of government and educational institutions such as schools, colleges and universities may not apply.

YEP is structured into two funding categories:

CATEGORY A: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts, such as sequential arts instruction, after-school arts programs, in-school arts residency programs, etc. These projects must be able to measure the impact of repeated participation in these programs on the students over the project period. **Applicants in Category A may request up to \$25,000.**

CATEGORY B: Provides project-based funding support to non-profit organizations for arts enrichment experiences for children and youth. **Applicants in Category B may request up to \$10,000.**

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) impact, 2) artistic merit, 3) management and financial capability, and 4) reach, giving priority attention to: projects that address children whose ability to participate in such programs may be limited by geography, economics or disability; and projects that provide children and youth the opportunity for ongoing/long-term direct participation in the arts.

Attached is a list describing the projects recommended for funding.

Funding for YEP is derived from funding granted to the Department from The Children's Trust (\$450,000). All funding recommendations are contingent upon approval of the Department of Cultural Affairs' FY 2014-2015 budget by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners and Mayor, and are subject to the availability of funds.

Grant funds will be used to support 10 sensory friendly professional children's musical theatre productions including public performances and school field trip shows for up to 4,000 youth with disabilities, from October 2014 - May 2015 at the Miracle Theatre in Coral Gables. Project activities will include being culturally enriched in a customized environment for children with autism and other sensory processing disorders providing modifications in lighting and sound, a quiet room with remote closed circuit viewing, and a pre-show guide.

Grant funds will be used to support Alhambra's Community Orchestra's Youth Outreach program for 900 underserved children and music students including: in-school visits by musicians and the full orchestra, scholarships for gifted students to receive coaching, a just-for-kids opera performance, and a concerto competition for young musicians with the winners performing for their peers.

Grant funds will be used to support Theatre for the Young Mind for 120 students ages 6 -18, from October 2014 - May 2015 at the Area Stage Company and at Our Pride Academy, a School for individuals with developmental disabilities. Project activities include attending performances, classroom training and unified performing activities in front of audiences. Participants will rehearse a musical play, which will enhance their critical thinking and public performance skills in a safe and disciplined environment.
