PROGRAM OBJECTIVE

Artists have lost income as a result of Coronavirus (COVID-19) due to cancelled performances, exhibitions, commissions, teaching jobs, workshops, speaking opportunities, etc. The Miami-Dade Artist Support! (MÁS!) Grants Program funds are unrestricted and may be used by artists to help with financial issues being faced as a result of the impact of this pandemic, such as rent, utilities, medical costs, insurance, food, etc. MAS! is designed to help individual artists, artist-entrepreneurs, creatives and cultural "gig" workers survive the impact of COVID-19 and in recognition of the contributions of Miami-Dade's outstanding artists to the fundamental vitality and creativity of our cultural life.

ELIGIBILITY

- All professional artists residing in Miami-Dade County are eligible to apply. A professional artist is defined as a person who, over a sustained period of time, has:

- 1. created and presented a recognized body of original artwork (e.g., visual and media artists, composers, choreographers, playwrights, poets, theater/film directors, costume designers, etc.); **OR**
- 2. established a career as an interpretive artist, teaching artist, cultural "gig" worker, and/or production artist (e.g., actors, musicians, dancers, singers, curators, art handlers, stagehands, stage managers, stage technicians, dance teachers, etc.); **AND**
- 3. worked to achieve the highest level of professional recognition. Professional artists demonstrate a sustained commitment to their artistic work, on an ongoing basis, and pursue this work as a means of livelihood.

- Applicants must demonstrate a serious and urgent need for financial assistance to be considered for this support.

- Applicants must be over 18 years of age.

- Artists must have resided in Miami-Dade County for one year at the time of application. Proof of residency will be required.

NOT ELIGIBLE: Students pursuing undergraduate or graduate degrees, non-professionals who engage in the arts as a hobby, or employees of Miami-Dade County are not eligible.

GRANT AWARDS

Grants may be awarded up to \$500 and are subject to the availability of funds. Applications will be evaluated on a first come, first served basis.

CATEGORY A: Artists who are first-time applicants to the MAS! program are eligible to apply in Category A.

CATEGORY B: Artists who previously received a MAS! grant award are eligible to apply in Category B.

- Resume or CV or Bio (PDF preferred)
- Artist Bio (up to 500 Words) Text Version OPTIONAL
- Artist Statement (up to 200 Words) OPTIONAL
- Total Financial Impact of COVID-19 on Your Artistic Practice
- Statement of Need (up to 300 Words)
- Work Samples (3 REQUIRED)
- 3 Support Documents (OPTIONAL, up to 3)
