Approval of April 20, 2022 Minutes

The minutes of the April 20, 2022, Council meeting were approved unanimously. (Motion by Mr. Bierman; seconded by Mr. Trieger)

FY 2021-2022 Community Grants (CG) Program Fourth Quarter Panel Recommendations

Mr. Spring reported that the FY 2021-2022 Community Grants program panel, co-chaired by Councilors Sandra Curbelo and Janá Sigars-Malina, convened on May 4, 2022 to review 23 applications requesting \$172,395.00 for the Fourth Quarter of the program. The Panel recommended funding 22 applicants for a total of \$151,395.00. The panel did not recommend funding the application received from National Art Exhibitions of the Mentally III, Inc. This organization is a longtime applicant that has consistently received funding from the program. Based on the track record of this project and the availability of grant funds, the staff recommendation is to include funding for this organization at \$5,944, the amount of their last most recent Community Grant. Staff will work with the organization to address Panel concerns regarding the project in the grant agreement when they provide updated project description and budget. With the additional recommendation the revised total recommended funding for the program is \$157,339.00.

FY 2022-2023 Grant Program Guidelines

Mr. Spring reported there are no substantive changes to the Community Grants (CG) grants program guidelines for the 2022-2023 funding year. The program is working well and transition from Graham Winick to Geraldine Toussaint as grant program administrator was successful. The guidelines were approved unanimously. (Motion by Mr. Bierman; seconded by Ms. Rees)

FY 2022-2023 Grant Program Panels

Mr. Spring presented the grant panels for the FY 2022-2023 Capital Development (CAP), Dance Miami Choreographers (DMC) and Major Cultural Institutions (MCI) grants programs. They were approved unanimously. (Motion by Ms. Rees; seconded by Ms. Chancy-Gonzalez)

FY 2022-2023 Festivals and Special Events (FEST) Grant Program Panel Recommendations

Mr. Spring reported that the Festivals and Special Events Grants Program Panel, chaired by Councilor Rosa Sugrañes, convened on May 6, 2022 to review 15 applications requesting a total of \$1,235,000. The Panel recommended funding all 15 applications. The Festivals and Special Events Grants Program is designed to support festivals and special events taking place in FY 2022-2023 which are coordinated and presented by legally incorporated 501(c)(3) notfor-profit Florida corporations and/or units of local government. Adriana Perez is the administrator of the grant program.

FY 2022-2023 Hannibal Cox, Jr. (HCJ) Grant Program Panel Recommendations

Mr. Spring reported that the Hannibal Cox Jr. Cultural Grants Program Panel convened on April 19, 2022 to review 27 applications requesting a total of \$810,000. The panel recommended funding all 27 applications. The Hannibal Cox, Jr. Cultural Grants Program provides funding and technical assistance support to mid-sized semi-professional and professional arts, scientific and historical organizations with a full-time presence in Miami-Dade County of presenting, performing or exhibiting a year-round season of cultural activities. Grants are awarded to not-for-profit, tax-exempt organizations with annual operating budgets of \$100,000 or more. Gilda Mooney, Chief of the Grants division chaired the panel on behalf of Councilor Trainer. Staff member Roxana Barba is the administrator of the grant program.

REPORTS AND DISCUSSION ITEMS

Update on the FY 2022-2023 County Arts Budget

Mr. Spring reported that Department staff met internally with Miami-Dade County Budget Office to review the Department's and Cultural Affairs Council's request for additional funding for next year. The initial feedback regarding the budget enhancements was positive. It is still very early in the budget process and the requests will need to be balanced with other pressures on the County budget. The Mayor will release her priorities for funding in June and the Miami-Dade County Commission will adopt preliminary millage rates in July.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

 On May 5, 2022, the Third District Court of Appeal ruled on the Coconut Grove Playhouse case, denying the City of Miami's appeal of the Court's earlier favorable ruling for Miami-Dade County. This ruling upholds the City of Miami Commission's support of the County's Coconut Grove Playhouse application to the City's Historic and Environmental Preservation Board for a Certificate of Appropriateness. The City of Miami has until this week to file subsequent legal action. The City Commission met and chose not to continue with legal action. The team has begun internal work to reactivate the project and move it to construction phase.

• Mr. Spring reminded Council members to complete the source of income statement for financial disclosure. The deadline is July 1st.
