Subject: FY 2021-2022 Community Grants Program – Fourth Quarter Recommendations

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Council approve the funding of 23 grants for a total of \$157,339.00 from the FY 2021-2022 Community Grants Program – Fourth Quarter.

BACKGROUND

In light of the uncertainty surrounding the impact of COVID-19 on public programs scheduled for the fourth quarter (July 1, 2022 – September 30, 2022), each proposal was evaluated based upon both the quality of the application and the ability to satisfactorily address each of the evaluation criteria, as stated in the program's guidelines. Before releasing grant funds to organizations, the Department will assess the feasibility of the grantees presenting public programs in identified venues and spaces; if necessary, the Department is prepared to exercise appropriate contractual flexibility to include virtual programs and other program delivery strategies, as may be necessary.

The FY 2021-2022 Community Grants program panel, co-chaired by Councilors Sandra Curbelo and Janá Sigars-Malina, convened on May 4, 2022 to review 23 applications requesting \$172,395.00 for the Fourth Quarter of the program. The Panel recommended funding 22 applicants for a total of \$151,395.00. The panel did not recommend funding the application received from National Art Exhibitions of the Mentally III, Inc. This organization consistently has received funding from the program. Based on the track record of this project and the availability of grant funds, the staff recommendation is to include funding for this organization at \$5,944, the amount of their last most recent Community Grant. Staff will work with the organization to address Panel concerns regarding the project in the grant agreement.

The projects recommended for funding represent a diversified range of activities and demographic locations. In its deliberations, the Panel carefully considered and applied the Community Grants guidelines as outlined below.

The Community Grants Program is responsive on a quarterly basis to organizations, which develop small and large-scale community-based programs, projects, events, and publications. The program is particularly sensitive to the needs of: 1) indigenous cultural neighborhood activities and projects encouraging the preservation of heritage, traditions and culture; and 2) social service organizations and cultural groups developing collaborative intervention projects.

The Panel specifically evaluated each applicant organization based on the following competitive review criteria: 1) quality of program; 2) administrative capability; 3) marketing strategy; 4) fundraising efforts; and 5) geographic location of event. Attached is a list describing the projects being recommended for funding.
